455 Additional Resource Teaching Posts Available for Children with Special Needs NCSE announces final allocations for 2013/14

The National Council for Special Education (NCSE) welcomes the recent budgetary announcement made by Minister Ruairí Quinn to allocate additional resource teaching posts to schools for children with special educational needs to meet the increase in demand for supports.

The NCSE is pleased to announce that an additional 455 resource teaching posts over and above the original allocation of 5265 will now be in place in primary and post primary schools. This will bring the total allocation of posts to over 5,700 in approx 3,750 schools.

NCSE Chief Executive, Ms Teresa Griffin said:

"The NCSE is delighted that additional posts have been made available in the budget to meet increased demand for support despite the difficult economic times. We also have a small number of posts left to deal with emergency applications during the year".

Today the NCSE published details of resource teaching allocations for every school for the 2013/14 school year on their website www.ncse.ie. Schools can access this information and will also be notified in writing on their final allocations.

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Notes to editors

1. Demand for resource teaching posts

The overall demand for resource teaching posts for the 2013/2014 school year exceeded the number of posts available. In June 2013, the Department of Education and Skills made the decision to adjust the basis for sanctioning resource teaching hours to schools at 85% of current policy level, in order to ensure that the NCSE had capacity to respond to further applications in the Autumn. These current allocations announced today are also being made at 85% of policy levels.

3. Educational and Non-Educational (Care) Support Available to Schools

Educational Support:

Role of the Class Teacher

The class teacher is responsible for the education of all children in his/her class. This includes pupils with special educational needs. Additional learning support and resource teaching support is provided to build on, and complement, the education delivered by the class teacher.

Role of the Learning Support Teacher

^{*} Maximum posts available

Learning support teachers are part of every school's staff. They provide additional tuition and support for pupils with learning difficulties.

Role of the Resource Teacher

The role of the resource teacher is to provide *additional teaching capacity* to mainstream primary and post-primary schools with pupils with special educational needs.

Non-Educational (Care) Support:

Role of a Special Needs Assistant (SNA)

SNA support is provided to schools with pupils who have significant care needs arising from a medical need or a physical disability (e.g. incontinence, paralysis) or sensory disability (i.e. blind/visual impairment; deaf/hard of hearing) or where their behaviour is a danger to themselves or others (e.g. a child runs out onto a road).
